Possible Search Key Words for *Russian Revolution* Topics

- The name of the person you are researching (e.g., Karl Marx, Leon Trotsky etc.)
 - NOTE: You may have to reverse the first and last names, so to search for “Josef Stalin” type in “Stalin, Josef”
- Russian Revolution
- Propaganda
- National Socialism

Databases

Google Books

Free book sources on the internet!!

1. Go to **Google** and click on the **More** tab.
2. Then, select **Books**.
3. Type in your search terms (e.g., “Russian Revolution”)
4. Then, click **Preview Available** on the left side of the page to get to the links of books with free content.

Webpath Express

1. Open the library catalog by clicking the desktop shortcut that says “**anhs library search**.”
 - a. You can also access this at home by going to www.library.rjuhsd.us
2. Choose “**Webpath Express**” along the left side of the page.
3. Type in your search term(s) in the “Find” bar at the top of the page.
4. Filter your results by **grade level** or **domain** (e.g., .com, .edu., gov, etc.) at the top.
